FASH Chat – from ‘Rubber Chicken’ to ‘The Emily Askew Band’

I was a young teenager about 17 years ago when I paid for an ad in ‘Solent Waves’ which said ‘Are there any young people out there that would like to start a folk band with me!’ [Oct 2000 - Ed]

As the daughters of two Morris dancers, my sister Hazel and I were taken around folk festivals from an early age. Sidmouth Folk Festival was a particular favourite and as we started learning instruments, we went along to children’s band workshops with members of brilliant ceilidh bands such as The Bursledon Village Band, Bedlam and Stomp. We joined Arrowhead Morris in Fareham, and learnt to dance ourselves, but we also wanted to make our own folk band, so I decided to put the advert in this magazine. We had a number of replies, and eventually ‘Rubber Chicken’ was born. With hindsight it wasn’t the best name, but it came from a warm-up exercise that we learnt at a children’s music workshop at the Gosport and Fareham Festival. Joining Hazel and me were Charlee Heys on fiddle and Tess Livingstone on bodhran (and we all continue to perform folk music in various guises). We played instrumental tunes from the UK and had a lot of support from Hampshire folk clubs. Catisfield and the Fo’c’sle Folk Clubs gave us some of our first paid gigs. During this time three of us played for Hampshire Appalachian team Metalllo Bocca, and two of us helped form the brand new rapper sword side Silver Flame. As we grew older, the group disbanded, and my sister and I started playing as the Askew Sisters. We again had some of our

first folk club spots through supportive organisers in Hampshire, and they really helped us learn our craft. Our Dad then started looking into songs collected from Hampshire which inspired us to delve further into George Gardiner’s collection. Over the years we have created arrangements of many Hampshire songs, and we collaborated with Craig Morgan Robson on the ‘Axford Five’ project.

During this time I studied Early Music at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. This included playing recorders, bagpipes, shawm, medieval violin, crumhorns and hurdy gurdy. I was drawn to Medieval and Renaissance music, and fascinated with the way the melodies reminded me of popular folk tunes. After I left college I started performing in Medieval bands such as Jogleasa, Medieval Baebes and The Dufay Collective, also The Artisans, which I formed myself. I also played for some early operas at Glyndebourne and a number of theatre shows at Shakespeare’s Globe, The Apollo West End and The Sam Wanamaker Playhouse.

I have always wanted to combine my interest in Folk and Early Music, so last year I started The Emily Askew Band, and together we take medieval and Renaissance melodies and bring them up to date in a modern folk style. The band features the fantastic musicians John Dipper (Fiddle/Viola D’Amore), Jamie Roberts (Guitar/Fiddle/Vocals) and Simon Whittaker (Percussion/Vocals) – I feel incredibly lucky to work with them all. This year we have been
