MINDEN ROSE WEEKEND OF DANCE 21 - 23 June 1996

Every two years The Minden Rose Ladies Garland Dancers organise a Weekend of Dance, where they invite many other Morris dance sides to come to Alton and dance and process through the town. This year looks like being the best yet as 15 teams from around the country have accepted and are looking forward to a day of dancing, music and summer fun in and around the streets of Alton.

THE ORIGINS OF MINDEN ROSE

On the 1st of August, 1759, during the Seven Years War, the battle of Minden was raging. Among the allied forces of Hanover, Prussia and Britain several British Regiments were bearing the brunt of the battle. To the fore were the Hampshire's who reputedly picked roses from the field of battle and put them in their hats. The group was named after the Minden Rose of Hampshire.

Formed in 1982 and taught by Roy Dommett, a well known collector and expert in the world of the Morris, Minden Rose give displays of garland, stick and hankie dances derived from sources as far apart as Clitheroe in Lancashire and Charlottesville in the USA. Many of the dances are, however, from local sources and this is reflected in their names such as 'The Hop Wain', 'Jane Austen's Quadrille', 'Great Wishford', and 'The Dummer 5 Hand Reel'. Several of the team also perform clog step dances. The costume was designed by members of the team and is based on Victorian photographs of working women in the Alton area.

The team have danced at many big and small events including the Jersey Battle of Flowers, Whitby Folk Festival, Chippenham Folk Festival and this year will be performing at Wimborne Folk Festival in Dorset, and also at Crawley Folk Festival. They also dance at village fetes and pubs.

New dancers, no experience needed - just lots of enthusiasm, and musicians are always welcome to swell the ranks. Practices take place from September to May every Sunday evening from 8pm to 10pm at the Boys Club, Nursery Road, Alton.

ENCARTA '95 SURPRISE

Rachel Mills needed to know about ballads for a school homework. She put the Encarta 95 disc into the computer CD ROM drive. (It's an encyclopedia with over 26,000 entries on it.) She clicked on the menu at Performing Arts and went into Music to find ballads, and as we have a sound card fitted she clicked on sound symbol.

I (Rob Mills) arrived home from work at exactly that moment to hear my Dad's voice coming out of the speakers singing "All jolly fellows that follow the plough". First verse only. I knew immediately the first word sounded 'twas' Dad!

We had absolutely no idea the recording made some 18 years ago had also been used for this, and we're thrilled that out of all the millions of songs and singers the Microsoft contributors could have chosen, they chose my Dad, Bob Mills, Rachel and Emily's Grandad.

Bob Mills died in 1981, aged 74, leaving Mum (now 91). Many of you will remember him singing at the Guildhall, Winchester, and other places for Woodfidley Ceilidhs etc. A walking stick in both hands, crippled by arthritis with terribly bowed legs, but my goodness he could sing. "Songs of a Hampshire Man" has sold well over 250 copies, all privately. "Let this room be cheerful" more than 150. He contributed tracks to H & IWNT "Countryside Calling", and "An English Folk Music Anthology" (two tracks on each).

Well done Grandad (Dad) - never say die ah?
