## FASH CHAT

I'm writing this during the cold snap in early April, and wondering what the weather will be like for the Easter holidays at the end of the month. As a child, brought up in Norfolk, there were so many things to look forward to at Easter. Good Friday was the day for Grandad to sow his bean seeds. We children always set off on a hike on that day, the first of the season, across the fields to the next village with a supply of jam sandwiches and 2d to buy tea or pop at Mother Brown's cottage on the way home. On Saturday we were busy colouring eggs (real ones). If you hard-boil an egg wrapped in onion skins it will turn out with a yellowy pattern, while cochineal in the water made the shells pink or red. Wrap a scrap of non-fast dyed material round and you might get unusual patterns. Living in a town house with no garden, we had never heard in that area of the Easter Bunny leaving eggs for the children to find. Did that tradition come to us from the USA? Sunday morning our breakfast eggs were often painted or had crayoned faces, but the hard-boiled eggs we had prepared were to be used for egg-rolling

competitions. Actually, my mother came from Northumberland, and I think it was she who told us of that game. Our baker sold two kinds of biscuits at Easter, one was pale and lemon-flavoured, the other brown and sweet with spice, but we called them "Fair Biscuits" because the marketplace was transformed with the Easter Fair arriving with the hoopla stalls, the dodgems, the swings and the Mat. Well, I hope your Easter was interesting this year. Are there any special Hampshire customs that you know of?

It was good to see a lot of May Day events listed in last month's issue, and I hope you will be able to go and watch some of them. Also the programme for "9 Days in May" Arts Festival in Havant Borough is out. (More details appear elsewhere in this issue.)

I hope to see lots of you at Soberton Village hall for the FASH AGM on Sunday, 7th May at 5pm and that you will join John Turner and me for the dance afterwards, with music by Pete and Sue Hall.

## 9 DAYS IN MAY FESTIVAL, HAVANT BOROUGH

The programmes are now out for the 9 Days in May Festival and can be obtained from the libraries, Havant Arts Centre, Tourist Information Centres and the reception at the Civic Offices of Havant Borough Council.

This year's programme is exciting and varied. A special programme at the Havant Arts Centre will feature comedy, community drama, musical performances and a wonderful children's art exhibition called Colour Montana inspired by Red Indian culture. Emsworth will host a barn dance with Reeler, there will be community concerts at Leigh Park and Cowplain and a special Have a Go Arts Day at Warren Park on the 13th. Hip hop enthusiasts have a dance and workshop at Bartons Green in the afternoon on the 14th and Havant Orchestras will show how musical pieces are learned, rehearsed and then performed all in 2½ hours on the 19th.

Reading groups will be launched, there

will be puppetry shows and a photographic exhibition in the libraries.

The jewel in the crown will be the Fabulous Finale at Staunton Park from noon to 6pm. The public are invited to picnic in the park (there will be food and refreshments) and listen to jazz, country, classical and other music, and enjoy a wide variety of performances including flamenco, morris, clogging and belly dance. There will be mime and drama. The climax will be a Festival Carnivale procession and public dance with the fabulous Merengada salsa and merenge band, from 4 to 6pm.
