FASH CHAT

Sometimes we "Oldies" can be proved wrong. How many times have you heard people say - "What's going to happen to the club, or the team, or the band, when we get too old to dance, or play anymore?" "Where are the next generation, who will keep up the Folk tradition?" Well, I can tell you not to worry. There are plenty of youngsters, and talented youngsters at that, to be seen showing off their skills at folk festivals all round the country. I was very impressed with the multi-talented team, The Fosbrooks, from the north-west, all under 18, who danced, played and sang at Sidmouth last year. This year at Chippenham the NYFTE team (National Youth Folklore Troupe of England), 32 of them, all between 10 and 18, selected from throughout the country, showed their many-sided skills in entertaining programmes in the arena and busking around the town.

It was a delight also to see the Tiddly Fidleys (Woodfidley's next generation) dancing with confidence on the arena stage, and at the Buttercross.

Looking no more than 10 or 12 years old, I saw young Sam Sweeney in the music tent surrounded by admirers, as he fiddled away in an amazingly mature style. He is the winner of Wiltshire Folk Association Youth Awards 2000. They are to be congratulated for organising this award every year, and giving youngsters the opportunity to show their skills to the general public.

They tell me that the children of Wickham put on a good show on May Day in Wickham square. It is good to know that there are still some enthusiastic

teachers who can find enough time to include country dance in their busy timetable.

I was very pleased to be invited to help Riders Infant School set up a Family Barn Dance as part of Havant's 9 Days in May festival. The children were very young, but they responded wonderfully to Nigel Barrell's calling, and Una Boulton's music, and the Head remarked that it was lovely to see smiles all round - children, their Mums (and a few Dads), and teachers as well. "When can we have the next one?" they all said.

One of the things FASH likes to do is support, where possible, any school that would like to give its pupils the experience of dancing to live music, perhaps once a year, just for the fun of it.

In the past schools in Gosport area have got together in this way, and the Waterlooville and Cowplain area more recently also. If you should know of any school that would like help in setting up an after-school dance club, or a one-off dance event, please mention it to any FASH committee member, and we'll see what can be done. Maybe not immediately, as we are approaching the end of our season and summer break. Talking of which - please support our end-of-season event at Soberton Village Hall on Sunday, 9th July from 3pm - 8pm. Mic Spenceley will be in charge of the dancing, to the music of Tap Roots, and I'm sure you will enjoy the cream teas on sale at the Hall in the interval.

MAY DAY WITH WICKHAM MORRIS

May Day for Wickham Morris and friends this year was blessed with fine weather, from greeting the dawn in Wickham Square at 5.15 am through to a final massed 'Acton' by about 150 dancers at dusk some 16 hours later.

In between, 3 sides - New Forest Medlars, Sarum Morris and Wickham Morris - spent an innovative Dancers' Own morning learning a completely new sequence devised by Dennis Wheeler (WM Dancemaster) before going into huddles to incorporate it into a dance in their own preferred styles. The idea worked satisfyingly well as Sarum produced their elegant hankied variation *a la* Bampton, Medlars a faster two short stick version and Wickham an even faster long stick Border style. Meanwhile, a smaller set of left over dancers came up with a Molly adaptation. The repertoires of each side are now one dance larger!

The afternoon saw us all dancing in Bishops Waltham - in the Palace Grounds, by The Crown and at The Bunch of Grapes, where we met up with Victory Morris and the Hobby Bobbies - thence to Fareham Precinct,

inaugurating the new bandstand in passing, and finally to Portchester Castle.

Back in the Square, the evening muster was - now traditionally - opened by the children of Wickham Primary school dancing round the maypole, with the Botley and Wickham Junior Morris sides ably demonstrating our traditions have a future, before the biggies took over sites around the Square. Despite competition from other events, May Day this year clashing with Bank Holiday Monday, Wickham Morris were delighted to welcome (as well as the indefatigable Medlars and Sarum) representatives from Alton, Arrowhead and Tricolex Morris, the ladies of Fleet, Minden Rose and Southsea Belles, and the flying feet of Devils Jumps with their solo style Lancashire clog dances.

We are very grateful to you all for your company and support in making it a memorable May Day, not least to the many, many people who enjoyed watching it all so much they contributed over £210 to our charity collection. Thank you, one and all.
