FASH CHAT

This is the hardest Chat I've ever had to write. As chairman of FASH I know that I speak for all the committee in expressing our sorrow at the loss of such a wonderful friend as Yvonne Ransom. We must pay tribute to all the work she did as secretary of FASH over many years, building up the role of FASH in South Hants. She encouraged and supported me when I first became Chairman, and her friendly approach to the Great and Small alike meant she was recognised wherever she went. It made for smoother and easier organisation of callers and bands, or dealing with hall bookings. Indeed, the most hesitant newcomer to Folk would soon feel at home, because Yvonne made a point of chatting and putting them at ease. She and Harold came regularly to Beaus of the Park club, and rarely missed a Soberton workshop or dance, but they also both enjoyed and found time to visit song clubs in the area, and thus were good ambassadors for FASH. Yvonne was so quick to jump in and offer help anywhere; you want someone on the door, selling tickets, or a raffle to organise? OK. Cups of tea for 30 to 40? No problem!

She was very proud of the Gold Medal that the EFDSS awarded her in recognition of her contribution to Folk. It was a revelation to me when I first went to the Folk and Craft weeks in the Isle of Wight, to see how clever Yvonne

was with her needle. Quilting, embroidery, concocting Christmas decorations, she could show you how, but what I treasure most were the beautiful personalised cards she would find time to prepare and send for a special birthday or anniversary.

It was heartening to see so many of Yvonne's friends from all parts of the country, and representing all aspects of the Folk world, come to the funeral to see her off in style. David Roberts, playing the organ, wove together some of the Playford tunes that she loved, and David Slater, who officiated at the service, made us feel that we were celebrating a life well spent. I believe Yvonne, herself, would have said in the words of Joyce Grenfell, "Weep if you must, Parting is hell, But life goes on, So sing as well."

Don't forget there are two events in November (some of the last that Yvonne arranged for us). On 12th November Barry Bullimore is coming to Soberton to lead a workshop of New England Contras. On Saturday, 18th November, we welcome David and Kathryn Wright with Stradivarious for our Playford Dance, also at Soberton Village Hall. Tickets for both events are £6 in advance (£7.50 on door). Cheques to John Turner, made payable to "FASH". See you there?
