WINCHESTER FOLK FESTIVAL 2001

Winchester Folk Festival will definitely go ahead in 2001 during May 11th to 13th. It will be similar to previous festivals with a concert and ceilidh programmed to take place in the Winchester Guildhall. The Bismarcks have already been booked for the Saturday evening dance. Saturday will be the main day for dance displays and music and song sessions throughout the centre of town and the Great Hall has already been reserved. It is planned to invite international sides and for the festival to have a multi-cultural dimension.

There has been a recognition that events like the folk festival are important for bringing visitors to Winchester and so the festival is looking to the Winchester City Council, and also performing arts organisations, for help

with funding.

In 2000, there was a day of dance in Winchester in May but no folk festival as such. This was partly because there was not sufficient commitment to funding but also because there was not enough volunteers. So if you have enjoyed Winchester Folk Festival in the past, please offer to help to keep it going and telephone Mike Winterson on 023 8025 4293 with your details. Mike will also be organising the folk concert and music and song sessions.

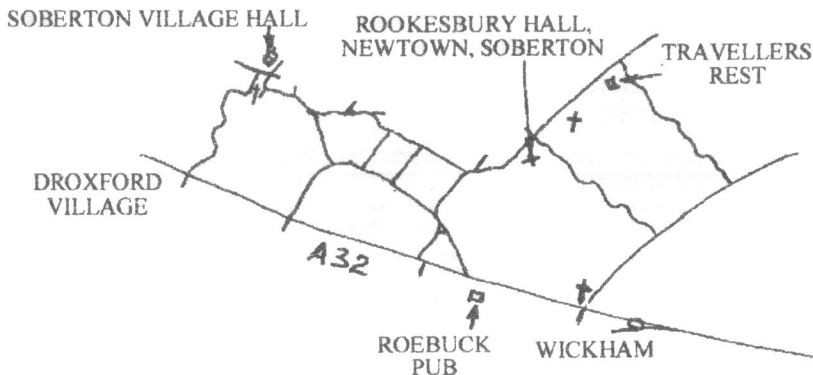
ROB MILLS RECORDED LIVE

An evening where he will be recorded 'live' has been organised. The recording will be taken by Paul Marsh, 'distinguished collector' - a member of Forest Tracks Records. Some of his recordings have been used on Topic's 'Voice of the People' 20 CD Millennium Issue. Paul has already made many recordings of Rob

over the last 25 years at all types of venues and events. It is hoped that a CD and tape can be achieved to bring the 25 years together.

The recording will take place at Rookesbury Hall, Newtown, Soberton (OS sheet 196, grid reference 610133, approximately 1½ miles from Soberton Village Hall) on Friday 26th January 2001. 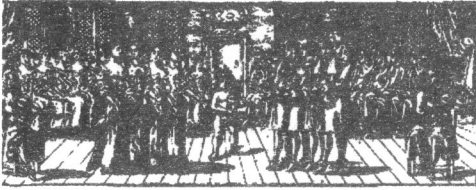

MARY IRESON

A truly happy anniversary occurred on 9th October 2000 when Mary Ireson celebrated 70 years of folk. She organised a party on the following Saturday at Four Marks Village Hall where many of her friends joined in the celebration.

In 1930 an older cousin invited Mary to join in the country dancing at Frensham Women's Institute. The first dance was on 9th October 1930 when they danced to records on an old wind-up gramophone. That was it! Mary loved dancing. Her cousin taught her the basics before going to dances. The first competition dances she learnt were Phoenix and Chelsea Reach. Then there were evening classes at Aldershot. The West Surrey Branch teacher was Suzanna Sharp, younger daughter of Cecil Sharp. Mary also met Sybil Lightfoot who taught technique at the EFDSS schools.

In 1940 evening classes started in Farnham and that was closer to home. Here Mary came to know her lifelong friend Rene Pike. The head of the Evening Institute in Farnham offered Mary some classes if she could get her teacher's certificate. This was a challenge!

In 1941 Mary went to Homerton College in Cambridge to get her First Year Elementary Folk examination. This included a one week revision course in Morris and Sword dancing taught by Olive MacNamara. The second year course for the Advanced Country Dancing examination was at Reading where Marjorie Sinclair was a teacher, and the adjudicator was Helen Kennedy, wife of Douglas. Then in 1943 Mary gained a silver badge at the advanced examination in Morris and sword dancing - quite an achievement.

Having attained a teacher's certificate Mary was able to pass on her skills. She taught at evening classes at Farnham and ran a club at Aldershot - quite difficult to do because of the blackout during the war. Later she took a club at Dorking.

Mary had learned to play the piano as a child, and family singing round the piano was a regular entertainment. It was Pat Shaw who

encouraged her to sing. Then in 1941 she started playing the accordion. She used to walk around, and even dance, playing her accordion and calling at the same time. She has always had a good memory for music and dances.

In 1945 Mary agreed to go to Medstead W.I. to teach dancing. From Farnham she travelled by bus and train to get there. A pianist was provided which was a great help. This group thrived for many years, eventually moving to Farringdon Village Hall in 1964. Musicians from this club formed a band with Mary, calling themselves The Weysiders. Just after Halsway Manor opened, they went down for a musical weekend with Pat Shaw and Nan Fleming-Williams. Mary can remember Pat Shaw dressing up in a pink tutu doing 'The Dance of the Dying Duck'. Other bands Mary encouraged to start were The Villagers, The Hillsiders, The Wessex Ranters and Allsorts.

In the 1970s Mary became involved with the nuns at Chertsey Remand Home where they were looking after girls from London. She taught the girls dancing, including sword dancing with wooden swords. Mary also became involved with physically handicapped girls at Woodlarks. She taught them to dance in wheelchairs. Eventually they formed a demonstration team and showed off their expertise in such dances as The Bishop, Newcastle and Picking Up Sticks.

Since 1966 Mary has shared a house with Rene, and these two good companions have travelled around together, Mary always driving her car, visiting Halsway Manor on 72 occasions so far.

Mary has devoted her life to folk. she has a tremendous energy and a sharp memory which has enabled her to make a huge contribution to the development and continuation of the folk scene in North Hampshire.

To quote from Mary herself, "Folk has given me a great deal in life, so that is why I try to help other people if I can".

social dance and Scottish dancing. I can rant, execute a cross-over Grimstock Hey at the drop of a hat and huckle back when necessary, although my schottische step is a bit rusty. But, I've never had to learn to dance as a lady.

Think of it, you chaps. Next time you meet a lady dancing as a man coming up the set towards you, she is probably a more accomplished dancer than you are. She has to know both ways of doing a ladies chain, allemande left on the corner could go either way, and in an improper longways she has to remember that the right side of the set is the wrong side (and *vice versa*).

So, to all you ladies out there who are ambidextrous (as my wife, Carol, puts it) and can swing both ways - congratulations, and hold your heads up. You've been underestimated for years. And, as for the quote at the top of the editorial - I saw it on a badge worn by one of the FASH committee at the last workshop. Who? My lips are sealed.
