FASH Chat – Golden Oldies

How long have you been folk dancing? Five years? Ten years? Twenty? Forty? OK - for some of us the answer is still, "longer than that". However long it is, you would expect things to have changed over the years.

Your favourite dances are unlikely to be the same as when you started. Maybe some of the bands you dance to are the same, but there are new ones. Do you use recorded music? Do you remember the 78s? (For the youngsters - that's the speed they used to rotate on the turntable.) Or was it 45s or LPs? It's probably now on a CD. And those of us who kept saying "longer" - we may not be quite as sprightly as we once were.

If you went to a folk dance club in the sixties - when my father first introduced me to folk dancing - the core of the repertoire could be found in the publications of the English Folk Dance and Song Society. In particular there was the Community Dance Manuals - a mix of traditional dances from England, some American and some newly composed dances in a similar style. Then there were the Country Dance books with Playford dances. These were for advanced dancers. There were collections like Dances from the Yorkshire Dales and Country Dances - New Series (of very old dances).

The bulk of the dances done at most clubs were the community or social dances. That extended to the club Saturday night dances. I danced many of the same dances through the sixties and seventies. There were my particular favourites - Dorset Four-hand Reel, Devil's Dream, Double Danish Quadrille, La Russe, Morpeth Rant and more. I could dance them week in, week out and still enjoy

them. Nowadays, ask any folk dance band when they last played even three of those five in the same evening and I bet they'll have a job remembering.

So what has changed? Well - given the change in the average folk dancer's stamina over the years, you can see why Dorset Four-hand and Morpeth Rant have dropped out. Those new to folk dance this century may never have danced a rant ever. The pressure to look for something new pervades all the marketing that bombards us and the folk dance repertoire has succumbed like so much else. Also, whereas once we wanted to exercise the body, we are now often wanting to exercise the brain.

However, as often happens, here and there the pendulum is swinging back. Dancers meet the social dances of the sixties and for some it's like an old friend that, having not met for years, you quickly slip back into the mutual enjoyment of each other's company. For others, the balance between walking the dance through and dancing it takes a sudden shift and they find they can think about the other people they are dancing with rather than which direction to turn, which place they are heading for. Dancing becomes more about enjoying movement to music with other people than enjoying mastering a complex pattern.

Don't get me wrong, I enjoy a well crafted contemporary dance with interesting patterns and flow, which needs dancers to keep alert and work together, danced to music that matches the moves. But the Golden Oldies still have their place.
